Government Decree 180/2022 (24 May)

declaring state of danger having regard to the ongoing armed conflict and humanitarian catastrophe within the territory of Ukraine and in order to mitigate the consequences thereof in Hungary and on certain state-of-danger rules

The Government,

acting within its power laid down in Article 53 (1) of the Fundamental Law,

acting, with respect to sections 2 to 4, within its original legislative power laid down in Article 53 (2) of the Fundamental Law, having regard to section 51/A (3) and (4) of Act CXXVIII of 2011 on disaster management and amending certain related Acts,

acting within its function laid down in Article 15 (1) of the Fundamental Law, decrees as follows:

1. Declaration of state of danger

Section 1 The Government hereby declares a state of danger in the entire territory of Hungary having regard to the ongoing armed conflict and humanitarian catastrophe within the territory of Ukraine and in order to mitigate the consequences thereof in Hungary.

2. Rules pertaining to the state of danger

Section 2 The Government hereby appoints the Prime Minister as the Government Member in charge of mitigating the consequences in Hungary of the state of danger.

Section 3 (1) Extraordinary measures related to the state of danger shall be provided for in separate Government Decrees.


(2) The Government shall continuously evaluate the need to sustain the state of danger and the extraordinary measures related to the state of danger.

(3) The Government requests the cooperation of citizens in implementing the extraordinary measures related to the state of danger.

Section 4 By way of derogation from section 46 (4) of Act CXXVIII of 2011 on disaster management and amending certain related Acts, the representative body of a settlement local government, the Budapest-Capital General Assembly, the county general assembly and their committees shall exercise their functions and powers themselves during the period of state of danger.

3. Final provisions

Section 5 This decree shall enter into force on 25 May 2022.
